Kids' College is a summer enrichment program designed to spark the imagination and expand the knowledge of youth entering grades 4 through 6 in the fall of 2017.

ELIGIBILITY

Any child who will enter grades 4 through 6 in the fall of 2017 can enroll. Students who do not display appropriate behavior will be removed from the program without a refund.

REGISTRATION AND TUITION

No registration is complete without a signed *application, registration, a signed release of waiver of liability* and *payment* for each student (p. 7-9). Complete and return all required forms to the UACCB community education office **no later than May 26, 2017**. After May 26, late registrations are accepted with a \$25 fee (no exceptions). Siblings pay \$25 less per week for the second child. Fees are as follows:

- \$180 full-day classes, includes lunch and two snacks each day
- \$105 half-day classes, includes one snack each day
- \$ 25 additional per week for lunch (optional for half-day student)

SCHOLARSHIPS

A limited number of partial scholarships are available. Parents or guardians must furnish a copy of their child's free/reduced lunch eligibility letter on school letterhead signed by a school official. You may request for the school to fax the free/reduced lunch eligibility letter to **Fax# 870.793.4988**. If the student is home-schooled, parent or guardians must furnish a copy of the 2016 individual income tax return (1040). The completed *scholarship application* (p. 10) must accompany the \$50 *payment* and the child's *application, registration and release of waiver of liability*. (p. 7-9). **Deadline to apply for scholarship is May 26, 2017.**

REFUND POLICY

Cancellations and requests for refunds must be received in writing (letter, fax, email) seven (7) business days prior to the start of each class session. Students dismissed from Kids' College due to disruptive behavior will not be eligible for a refund.

GRADES 4-6

Course Descriptions

Arkansas Indians. Did you know that there were three Indian groups that lived in Arkansas? In this class, you will make a war mask, a paper sack horse and study a famous American Indian artist. Lisa Harber-Hurtt, instructor.

Bugs are a Blast! Explore the weird, wacky wonderful and sometimes wicked world of those creepy, crawly critters that bug us – insects! Dana Barber, instructor.

Blast Off Learning. Blast off into learning about space in this interactive, hands on class. You will conduct research about the solar system by performing experiments with toilet paper, marshmallows, Oreos, homemade moon sand and more! Ronda Bryant, instructor.

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Blast Off with Coding. Blast off to learn about coding with fun *unplugged* activities such as the robotic astronaut, alien the programmer, mars obstacle course and more! You will learn to love computer science! Denise Hogan, instructor.

Books Galore. Read a good book and do a different art activity each day. Lisa Harber-Hurtt, instructor.

Cool Cooking. Do you want to learn how to cook without the cooking? Learn how to make no-bake cookies, Cheerio treats, Oreo delight and several other delicious desserts without even having to use the stove. Create a personalized recipe book to take home! Amy Walling, instructor.

Cosmic Creations. Have fun in astronomical proportions creating space themed crafts. Create solar system dioramas, jet packs, coffee filter planets, rockets, spaceships, puffy moon paint and more. Melanie Brustrom, instructor.

Countdown to Fun with Chemistry! Conduct cool chemistry activities with common household ingredients. Make slime, a simple rocket and more! Test acids and bases and learn fun tricks with water. Instructions will be provided so activities can be repeated at home. Dana Barber, instructor.

Edible Science Experiments. In this class, discover that ordinary things like gum drops and gobsoppers can be scientifically amazing. Whitney Morehead, instructor.



Escape This! Do you enjoy challenges? Are you good at solving riddles and puzzles? Have you ever been to an escape room? In this class, you will play games that teach critical thinking, teamwork and problem solving. Each day you will be a super spy and solve a mystery. Each piece of the mystery will lead you to another clue. Can your team be the first to solve the mystery? Amy Walling, instructor.

Famous Art. Learning about famous artists can be lots of fun! Create your own masterpieces as you explore famous artists' work and their techniques using pop candy art, splatter paint and more. Jessica Harber, instructor.

Junk Drawer Crafts. Everyone has a junk drawer. This class will showcase your true creative side! Make cool space crafts using things that you might find lying around the house. Build a rocket, make a galaxy in a bottle, construct your own jet pack and more! Jessica Christopher, instructor.



Leader in Me. Discover the leader in you as you explore the 7 habits of a good leader through team building activities, making kindness postcards and doing random acts of kindness. Jessica Harber, instructor.

Lego Exploration. Explore and use your imagination to build and create with virtual Legos. Build balloon powered moon buggies, catapult launching stations, astronaut zip lines and more. Denise Hogan, instructor.

May the Forces Be With You. In this class, engineer and design a variety of STEM projects that have been used in space exploration. Learn how to build a robotic working hand, find out how the moon got its craters, design a crew exploration vehicle and much more! Glenita Anderson, instructor.

Nature Walk. See what the natural state has to offer by exploring the greenery on campus and getting your hands dirty by making seed mosaics, dissecting flowers, exploring backyard soil and more. Jessica Harber, instructor.

Out of This World Snacks. Create out of this world snacks that you can eat in class. Make astronaut ice cream, rocket ship fruit kabobs, Jupiter juice, astronaut pudding, moon phase Oreos and more. Melanie Brustrom, instructor.

Pizzazz with Picasso. Use pantyhose to make a sculpture that was once designed by the famous artist Picasso and leave your friend wondering how you made this! Lisa Harber-Hurt, instructor.

Robots to the Rescue. Ever heard of junk sculpture? In this class, you will make an awesome robot out of junk. Each robot will be different! Lisa Harber-Hurt, instructor.

Science Games. Ever heard of “Minute to Win It” games? Build your own boat, compete in teams to be the last boat floating after pennies are stacked inside, create the largest toothpick tower, be the first to win the sponge bucket challenge or see how you fare at target practice with Nerf guns! Amy Walling, instructor.

Scientific Kitchen Helpers. Explore mixing solids and liquids to make some delicious desserts. Whitney Morehead, instructor.



Scoping the Earth & Beyond. Lenses let you scope the earth and beyond up close and let you see things that are otherwise out of sight. In this class, you will make slides for the microscope, build your own working telescope to see into space and learn how a periscope allows you to see underwater and around the corner. Glenita Anderson, instructor.

Space Explorations. Explore the vast solar system by conducting hands-on science experiments and space activities. Create a solar system model, make Alka-Seltzer rockets, soda bottle water rockets, fizzing Jupiters, nebula in a jar and more! Melanie Brustrom, instructor.

Space Jam Dancing. Jam in space as you learn dances that are out of this world. No experience needed, just have fun moving your body! Ronda Bryant, instructor.

Unusual Science. Ever made elephant toothpaste, golden glitter slime or a bottle rocket? In this class, you will conduct some strange and unusual science experiments. Whitney Morehead, instructor.
