I. Purpose and Scope

In recognition of the public school mergers and the changes in school district boundaries, and to offer more opportunities for neighboring students, UACCB offers a scholarship program called "New Frontier Scholarships." "Project College Bound Graduate" [?]. This program encompasses These scholarships are awarded to students whose official residences are outside Independence County, but who graduated from or are currently enrolled in a school district in Independence County or whose geographic boundaries include parts of Independence County. The districts listed are partners in the Project College Bound Program with UACCB and utilize the in-district area as their educational and economic hub.

III. Procedure

Students meeting this eligibility criteria will be classified as "in-district" upon evaluation of application of admission to UACCB and confirmation of attendance and graduation from an included high school. The amount of the scholarship would be the difference between the out-of-district and in-district tuition rates up to a cap of 15 hours per semester and this opportunity would be available to graduates starting with the Class of 2005 and to concurrently enrolled students starting in the fall semester of 2005. The scholarship would require a student submit an electronic application for admissions to the college single page application to be applied for once each academic year (usually in the fall term) and this status would be automatically administratively renewed for the duration of the student's continued attendance in the spring and summer terms for up to 4 consecutive fall and spring terms provided satisfactory academic progress is maintained obtained. Each fall the eligible applicants could resubmit their application requests.
