ACT, Accuplacer, or SAT. (Your test score could make you elligible for a UACCB scholarship)



Submit Official Transcripts

Official transcripts include high school, GED, colleges, universities, or trade schools.



Submit Proof of Immunizations

Proof of 2 measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR) vaccinations or Arkansas Department of Health approved evidence of immunity or exemption accepted.

Disability Services and Accommodations for Students



Types of Accommodations

Accommodations are determined individually through collaboration with Access & Testing Services. Examples include but are not limited to:

- Lecture Access: Audio recordings, screen readeraccessible content, instructor or peer notes, transcription, or sign language services.
- Academic Aids: Use of tools like calculators, computers, spell checkers, and text-to-speech devices.
- Assistive Technology: Screen readers and magnifiers.
- Interpreters/Transcriptionists: Available upon request; early registration recommended.
- Parking: Handicap-accessible spaces are marked and available.
- Mobility Access: Wheelchair users should report access issues.
- Testing Accommodations: Options include extended time, quiet environments, assistive technology, scribes, and spell checkers.

Request Process:

- Student Request: Submit via the <u>UACCB</u>
 <u>Request for Accommodations Form</u> or contact
 Access & Testing Services directly at 870-612 2056 or 870-612-2013 or <u>access@uaccb.edu</u>.
- Make a request in person: You can begin the request process at the Access & Testing Services Office in the Main Classroom Building.
- Provide Disability Documentation: Must include a clear diagnosis, student's name, professional credentials, and how the disability affects functioning. Acceptable documents include IEPs, 504 plans, or a Summary of Performance.
- Interactive Process: A meeting is scheduled between Access Services and the student to discuss needs and complete paperwork.
- Notification: Accommodation Letters are sent via DocuSign to students and instructors.
- Continued Communication: Students must notify Access Services if classes change to update accommodation letters and if they enroll the following semester.

Limits: Personal services (e.g., caregiving, transportation) are not provided.

Accommodations from high school are not automatically transferred. Students must self-identify and follow the procedure to make a request for accommodations.

FINANCIAL RESOURCES

- Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) Use UACCB's FAFSA code **014042** to apply for federal grants, loans, and work-study.
- Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Awarded based on academic performance for Arkansas residents.
- **ARFuture Grant Program** Covers tuition and fees for students pursuing STEM or regional high-demand fields such as teaching or nursing; 35+ UACCB programs qualify.
- Arkansas Workforce Challenge Scholarship Available for credit and non-credit training in healthcare, IT, and industry.
- UACCB Foundation Scholarships Local scholarships funded by community donors and alumni.
- Federal and State Work-Study Programs Earn money while attending college through part-time campus jobs.
- Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Assistance for eligible students in approved career training programs.

- All scholarships are awarded based upon the availability of funds.
- Limit one institutional scholarship per student.
 Students are defaulted to the highest-level scholarship for which they qualify.
- A student must be a first-time entering college student to qualify.
- All scholarships are for fall and spring semesters only.
- UACCB scholarships are administered according to college guidelines and awarded only to students who have applied for admission to UACCB.

- Requirements: Composite ACT of 27 OR Accuplacer Avg. of 275
- · Awarded \$1,500 in fall and \$1,500 in spring

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIP

\$2,500 for the academic year

- Requirements: Composite ACT of 23 OR Accuplacer Avg. of 266 OR GED Avg. of 165
- Awarded \$1,250 in fall and \$1,250 in spring

ACADEMIC DISTINCTION SCHOLARSHIP

\$2,000 for the academic year

- Requirements: Composite ACT of 19 OR Accuplacer Avg. of 246
- Awarded \$1,000 in fall and \$1,000 in spring

ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP

\$1,000 for the academic year

 Must be first-time entering students in the first semester following high school graduation.

- Requirements: Arkansas Scholar OR First Place Skills USA OR HOSA State Officer OR Valedictorian or Salutatorian
- Awarded \$500 in fall and \$500 in spring

Scholarships are renewable for 3 consecutive semesters with 12 credit hours completed each semester AND 3.00 GPA minimum cumulative GPA.



LEVEL UP YOUR FUTURE

Students can get a jump-start on their future by taking college courses for free or reduced cost as early as their freshman year of high school. Courses are offered online and on-campus with bus transportation provided by most school districts.

Arkansas ACCESS Act

Earn college credit in high school at no cost to the student or parents! Students in grades 9-12 can enroll in up to 15 hours per semester not to exceed 30 hours per academic year. Ask your high school counselor or career coach to learn more.

UACCB graduates can transfer to the University of Arkansas and **continue paying the same tuition rate!** The Arkansas Transfer Achievement Scholarship allows students who obtain an associate degree from UACCB to pursue a bachelor's degree at the University of Arkansas without an increase in tuition rate. SMART CHOICE TUITION WAIVER PROGRAM THE UNIVERSITY OF ARKANSAS - FORT SMITH

UAFS will waive \$100 of tuition per credit hour for up to 90 total credit hours or the completion of you degree, whichever comes first. Eligible students must transfer at lease 30 earned credit hours from UACCB and hold a 2.0 GPA or higher at the time of transfer.
