INFORMATION AND APPLICATION PACKET
*FALL ENTRY – FOR CLASSES STARTING IN AUGUST****

The registered nursing traditional pathway is a 3-semester, 67-credit-hour program that combines classroom instruction, simulated patient care, and clinical experience to prepare graduates for a successful career in nursing. After graduation, students are eligible to apply for the national examination (NCLEX-RN) administered by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing, for licensure as a registered nurse (RN).

Successful completion of this program meets the educational requirements of the Arkansas State Board of Nursing. However, program completion does not guarantee approval to take the NCLEX-RN examination nor does it guarantee eligibility to be licensed as an RN. (See Potential Bars for Licensure below).

Length of the Program: 3 semesters

Method: On campus, face-to-face delivery

Course Availability: Fall and Spring Entry Available

Important: Clinical rotations will be scheduled with as much advance notice as possible; however, they may be subject to change. Not all clinicals are in Batesville. The institution is not responsible for organizing or providing transportation for clinical rotations.

APPLICATION PERIOD

The application period for the Registered Nursing Traditional Pathway program opens May 1, 2026 and closes June 30, 2026, at 11:59 p.m.

The application must be completed prior to the deadline. **No incomplete or late applications will be considered.**

Important: Once the application period opens, submit your applications in a timely manner. In the event of a tie in scores, the application date and time may be used as a tiebreaker.

REGISTERED NURSING PROGRAM APPLICATION PROCESS & TIMELINE

STARTING TODAY:

- Apply to UACCB. <https://www.uaccb.edu/application/>
 - **Application, admission, and onboarding for UACCB must be completed before you can apply to the nursing program.**

- Complete the request for information form ([UACCB Nursing Program Admissions Information Request Form](#)) or email the UACCB Nursing Program at nah@uaccb.edu to be added to the Interested Student Contact List.
 - Please include the following in your email:
 - Your full name
 - Any names you are registered under or have used for testing
 - The program you are interested in

LAST WEEK OF APRIL:

- The nursing program will send application instructions to students who have requested information using the UACCB Nursing Program Admissions Information Request Form. These instructions will also be posted at uaccb.edu/nursing

MAY 1ST-JUNE 30TH:

- Complete the Traditional RN (Registered Nurse) Nursing application.
- Once your application is received, an automated confirmation email will be sent to your **UACCB student email account within 24–48 hours**. This email will contain instructions on how to submit documentation for any bonus points for which you may be eligible. Students will only be considered for the specific program(s) for which an application has been submitted. If you apply to multiple programs, you will receive a separate confirmation email for each.
- If you are eligible for any of the following bonus points, it is your responsibility to submit the required documentation as outlined in the confirmation email. Certifications and licenses must be valid at the time of submission to qualify. Bonus points will not be applied if the required documentation is not received. For more information regarding bonus points, please refer to page 6.
 - Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA)
 - NREMT-Basic or Higher
 - United States Veteran

FOLLOWING THE SUBMISSION OF YOUR NURSING APPLICATION:

- Carefully review the automated confirmation email sent to your UACCB student email account. UACCB has multiple programs with open applications at the same time, and it is the student's responsibility to ensure they have applied to the correct program.
- If you do not receive a confirmation email within 48 hours, please email nah@uaccb.edu to inquire about the status of your application. Please allow up to 72 hours for a response.
- If the name on your application does not match the name on your entrance exam results, please email nah@uaccb.edu and request that additional names be added to your application. It is the student's responsibility to ensure that test scores are linked to their application. We do not receive any identifying information on test scores other than the name provided.
- All correspondence regarding your application, including admissions or acceptance details, will be sent **exclusively to your UACCB email address**. Personal email addresses will not be used for these communications. Please ensure you regularly check your UACCB email and respond to any communication related to your application

Important: If any items are missing from your application, you will receive an email from the nursing department specifying what is needed. **It is critical that you respond promptly to these emails.** Applications that remain incomplete because the student does not respond to requests for additional information will not be considered for admission.

PROGRAM APPLICANT ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Cumulative college Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.0 or higher on a 4.00 scale.
- Score proficient on the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) admission exam. (See *additional information below*)
- Complete all prerequisite courses with a grade of “C” or higher.
 - If an applicant has a transcribed D or F in a prerequisite course and **has not** completed the course earning a “C” or higher by the time of selection, they are ineligible for the selection process, even if currently enrolled in or registered to retake the course.
 - Only transcribed grades will be accepted at the time of selection.
 - No more than 8 credit hours of prerequisite courses can be outstanding at the time of selection. Selections are made in early November.
- Submit official transcripts from all colleges attended to the admissions office for transfer credit evaluation.
 - It is the student’s responsibility to ensure transcripts are on file by the deadline for the program for which the student is applying.
- Electronically sign the RN application to acknowledge understanding of the Arkansas [Nurse Practice Act Annotated Code 17-87-312](#) and [17-3-102](#) regarding criminal offenses and licensure.
- Upon acceptance into the program, complete a mandatory Criminal Background Check. **Please note, findings on a criminal background check may prevent attendance at clinical sites, resulting in the inability to meet the program requirements.**
- Electronically sign the RN application to acknowledge understanding of the required physical and mental abilities essential for safe and effective client care (see below).
- Ability to pass drug screening throughout the program. UACCB has deemed all Nursing and Health Professions students to be in safety-sensitive positions. In safety-sensitive positions, it is crucial to maintain a drug-free environment. Because nursing students are considered safety-sensitive under Arkansas law, the use of medical marijuana is prohibited regardless of possession of a medical marijuana card. This ensures safety and compliance with regulations.

POTENTIAL BARS FOR LICENSURE AS A NURSE

Upon application for licensure, per the Arkansas [Nurse Practice Act §17-87-312](#) all nursing students are mandated by state law to be fingerprinted and have a state and federal criminal background check at the student’s expense. Please note that,

- Persons convicted of certain crimes may not be eligible to take the state board examination.
- Completion of this program does not guarantee eligibility to write state board examination according to the [Nurse Practice Act §17-87-312](#).

REQUIRED IMMUNIZATIONS

Upon acceptance, students must provide documentation of the following immunizations in order to attend clinical rotations and meet program requirements. UACCB does not require student vaccination against COVID-19 or Influenza (flu); however, most clinical facilities do. To be eligible to attend required clinical rotations, you must provide proof of required vaccination(s) **or** apply for and receive an exemption from each clinical facility based on either:

1. Religious reasons, or
2. Medical reasons.

Each facility requires its own exemption application, along with any additional supporting documentation. It is the student's responsibility to apply for the exemption and provide proof of exemption approval. Students who are employed at a facility and have an employee exemption must still complete the student exemption process, per facility policy.

Not all clinical facilities grant student exemptions. If a student is prohibited from attending clinical sites and cannot meet program objectives, the student will not be able to successfully complete the program. **UACCB cannot grant exemptions.**

Immunization Compliance Deadlines:

All required immunizations must be compliant **no later than August 31** of the admission year, with the exception of the current seasonal Influenza (flu) vaccine. The Influenza vaccine must be compliant **no later than October 1** of the current flu season. Failure to meet these deadlines will result in inability to attend clinical rotations and may jeopardize progression in the program.

Required Immunizations:

- MMR (2 doses) or a positive titer showing immunity to Measles, Mumps, and Rubella
- Hepatitis B series or a signed waiver declining vaccination
- Varicella (2 doses) or a positive titer showing immunity to Varicella (Chicken Pox)
- TB skin test, blood test, or chest X-ray (per CDC guidelines)
- COVID-19 vaccination series (Johnson & Johnson [1 dose], Pfizer [2 doses], or Moderna [2 doses]) or proof of exemption as described above
- Influenza vaccine for the current season

MENTAL & PHYSICAL ABILITIES STATEMENT

Each student should be aware of the mental and physical abilities required in each program. If you determine that you are unable to do any of the skills listed and have a documented disability, you will need to determine if reasonable accommodation can be provided. To request accommodation, you will need to contact UACCB's Access and Testing Services office and present documentation of your disability.

Each student will be expected to perform the following essential functions to perform the work necessary to complete the Nursing Program:

1. Work in a standing position and walk for prolonged periods of time.

2. Lift and transfer clients up to 6 inches from a stooped position, then push or pull weight up to 3 feet.
3. Lift and transfer clients from a stooped to an upright position to accomplish bed-to-chair and chair-to-bed transfers.
4. Apply up to 10 pounds of pressure to bleeding sites and in performing CPR.
5. Respond and react immediately to auditory instruction, request, and/or monitor equipment, perform auscultation without auditory impairment.
6. Perform up to twelve hours in a clinical laboratory setting.
7. Perform close and distance visual activities involving objects, people, and paperwork, and discriminate depth and color perception.
8. Discriminate between sharp/dull and hot/cold when using hands.
9. Perform mathematical calculations for medication preparation/administration.
10. Communicate effectively, both orally and in writing, using appropriate grammar, spelling, vocabulary and penmanship with classmates, faculty, and community members.
11. React appropriately under stressful situations.
12. Demonstrate evidence of critical thinking in various settings.
13. Demonstrate gross and fine motor dexterity.
14. Participate effectively in group activities.

TEAS ADMISSION EXAMINATION – MUST BE COMPLETED ON OR BEFORE JUNE 30, 2026

The TEAS exam is comprised of 170 questions, 20 of which are non-scored pretest items, with a time limit of 209 minutes. The exam has 4 individually timed test sections based on 9-12th-grade science, reading, math, and English language comprehension.

Estimated Exam cost: approximately \$87.00.

Study aids: The current ATI TEAS study manual and practice exams are available at www.atitesting.com.

TEAS EXAM REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must score proficient (currently 58.7%) or higher on the TEAS exam to be eligible for selection. *Applicants scoring below 58.7% will not be eligible for consideration.*

- The exam must have been taken within the previous 12 months at the time of selection (July 1, 2025 - June 30, 2026).
- Applicants are allowed a maximum of three (3) attempts in a 12-month period, with a minimum of 4 weeks (28 days) between attempts. It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure the proper time has elapsed between attempts.
- The highest score will be used in the selection process.

On-Site Testing at UACCB:

- Testing will be available at the UACCB Testing Center.
- There is no additional cost for transcripts for students testing on-site, as UACCB will automatically receive an official transcript.

- When registering for the TEAS exam, enter “U of AR CC Batesville” to send your complimentary transcript (official score) to UACCB.
- Dates for on-site testing will be posted on the UACCB website.

Testing at Other Institutions:

- Exams taken at other institutions will only be accepted if an official transcript is sent directly to UACCB from ATI and meets the specified criteria.

Important: Scores from online proctored TEAS exams will not be accepted.

*All prerequisite and co-requisites courses must be completed with a grade of “C” or higher.

SELECTION RUBRIC

The nursing program utilizes a competitive, selective admissions process. Because the number of qualified applicants may exceed the number of available seats, all eligible applicants will be evaluated using a standardized point system.

The UACCB Nursing Program evaluates applicants using the GPA of required prerequisite courses and any completed corequisite courses, rather than the overall cumulative GPA. Applicants will be scored according to the following rubric:

- Required prerequisite and completed corequisite GPA will account for a maximum of 100 points of the total 200 points possible. GPA is multiplied by 25 to determine points awarded (e.g., $4.0 \times 25 = 100$ points).
- The TEAS composite score will account for a maximum 100 points of the overall 200 points possible.

Bonus points may be awarded to applicants who submit appropriate documentation for the following:

- Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) with copy of current state certification = 1 point
- NREMT-Basic (or higher) with copy of current state license = 1 point
- United States Veteran with copy of DD214 = 1 point
- All prerequisite courses completed and transcribed at the time of selection = 1 point

In the event of a tie in total score, the date and time the application was submitted may be used as a tiebreaker.

SELECTION NOTIFICATION

Electronic notifications will be sent for acceptance, alternate, or denial using the UACCB official email address of the applicant.

Up to 24 of the top-scoring applicants are accepted into the program and 5 alternates are chosen.

Students must return the formal acceptance to the nursing department by the date specified or the seat will be forfeited.

Anyone receiving a letter of ineligibility or denial who would like additional information may request an appointment with the Director of Nursing.

MEET & GREET

All applicants are encouraged to attend a scheduled Meet & Greet. Applicants will receive additional program details, can ask questions, meet faculty, administration, and current nursing students.

There are two dates for the Meet & Greet:

Thursday, April 23, 2026 at 5:30 pm in the Nursing & Allied Health Building

Saturday, June 20, 2026 at 2:00 pm in the Nursing & Allied Health Building

This event is for the applicant and their support group (i.e., spouse, significant other, parents, children, family members, friends, etc.).

ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNERS

The Arkansas State Board of Nursing requires all nursing students who speak English as a second language to pass an English proficiency examination. TRANSFER CREDIT

A student requesting a transfer from another college must meet the UACCB transfer policies outlined in the college catalog.

MILITARY SERVICE

Any student whose plan of study is interrupted due to military service obligations while enrolled in the nursing program will be guaranteed readmission upon return. The student will be required to meet the readmission standards set by the program.
