

Adult Education

The Adult Education Department offers a variety of classes for individuals working to improve basic skills, obtain an Arkansas high school diploma (GED), and learn English. All classes provided by the Adult Education Department are free and open to the public. Adult Education classes are offered year-round. More information about services provided can be found online at www.uacccb.edu or by contacting the Adult Education department.

The following classes and tests are offered:

- GED Preparation for 16–17-year-old students with appropriate documentation, and adults 18+ seeking an Arkansas high school diploma
- GED Testing
- Adult Basic Education (ABE) Classes for students seeking to improve reading, writing, and mathematics skills
- English as a Second Language (ESL) classes for adults 18+
- Integrated Education and Training (IET) programs that combine adult education and academic support with employment preparation and workforce training to assist students in obtaining nationally recognized credentials and employment in fields such as commercial driving, welding, and healthcare
- Customized basic skills training for business and industry

Classes on the UACCB campus are offered during the day, Monday through Thursday and during the evening on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Classes at the Sharp County Adult Education Center are offered during the day Monday through Thursday.

Distance Learning options are available to eligible students in both Independence and Sharp counties who meet minimum placement requirements on the TABE assessment.
