Kids' College is a summer enrichment program designed to spark the imagination and expand the knowledge of youth entering grades 1 through 3 in the fall of 2019.

ELIGIBILITY

Any child who will enter grades 1 through 3 in the fall of 2019 can enroll. Students who do not display appropriate behavior will be removed from the program without a refund.

REGISTRATION AND TUITION

No registration is complete without a signed *application*, *registration*, a *signed release of waiver of liability* and *payment* for each student (p. 7-9). Complete and return all required forms to the UACCB community and technical education office no later than May 17, 2019. After May 17, late registrations are accepted with a \$20 fee. Siblings pay \$25 less per week for the second child. Early bird registration fees received by **May 17** are as follows:

- \$190 full-day classes, includes lunch and two snacks each day
- \$115 half-day classes, includes one snack each day
- \$ 25 additional per week for lunch (optional for half-day student)

SCHOLARSHIPS

A **limited** number of partial scholarships are available. To be eligible for the scholarship, parents or guardians must furnish a copy of the 2018 individual income tax return (1040). The completed *scholarship application* (p. 10) must accompany the \$60 *payment*, the *copy of the 1040*, the child's *application*, *registration* and *release of waiver of liability*. (p. 7-9). **Deadline to apply for scholarship is May 17, 2019. First come, first serve.**

REFUND POLICY

Cancellations and requests for refunds must be received in writing (letter, fax, email) seven (7) business days prior to the start of each class session. Students dismissed from Kids' College due to disruptive behavior will not be eligible for a refund.
